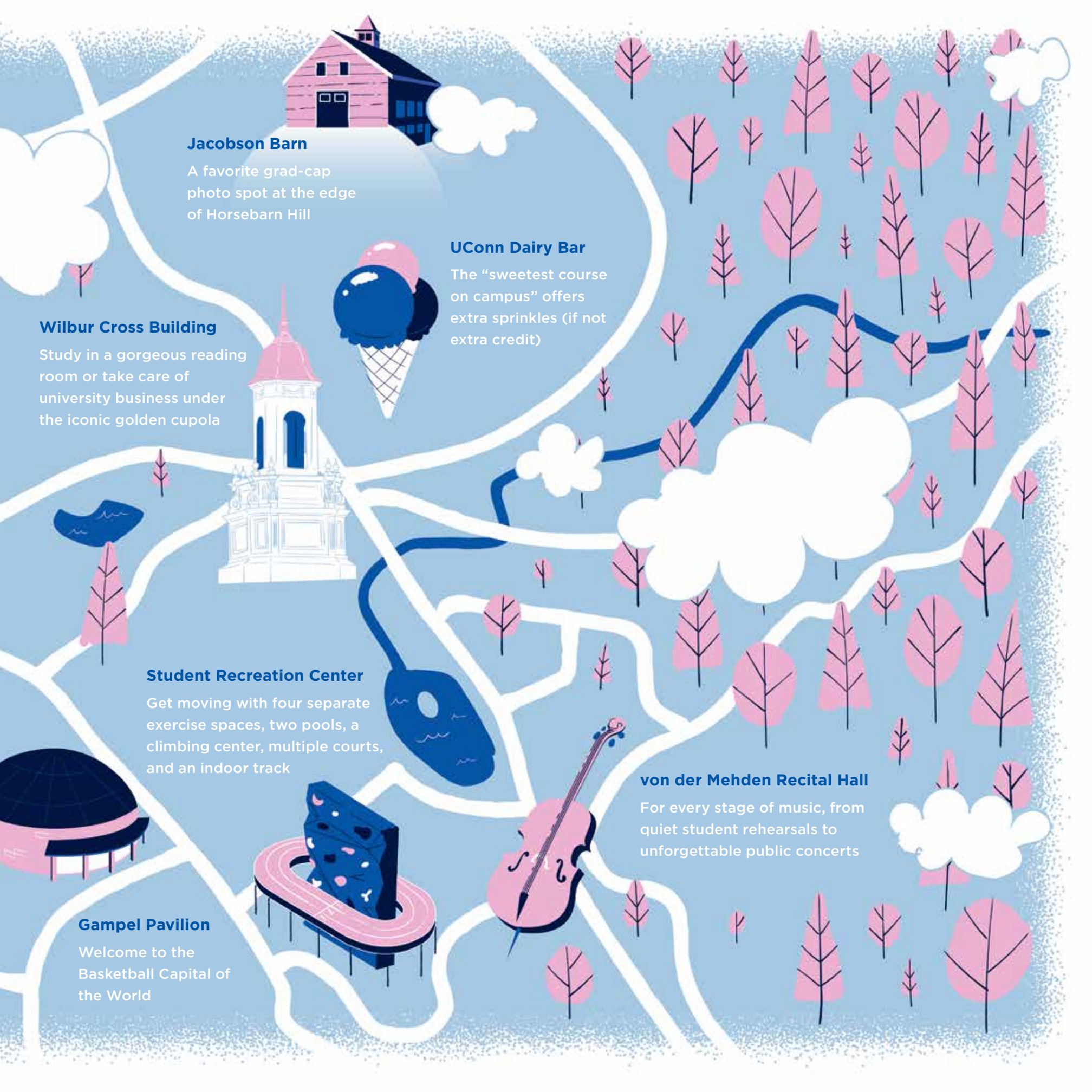

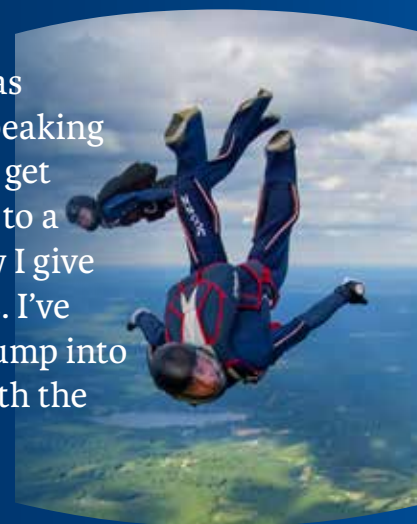


Give Forward
