Standardized Test Scores

At UConn, we understand that one test may not accurately define a student's academic progress and potential, which is why we are allowing first-year applicants the option to submit standardized test results.

If you believe your SAT or ACT scores reflect your academic ability and want them considered, UConn requires official scores to be sent directly from the testing agency. Writing and science sections are not required or used in our review.
